
Together, we've helped hundreds of families heal from the genocide. Five more years will complete our mission.



Foundation Rwanda Has Helped 850 Students Further Their Education

- 20 students are attending primary school
 - 707 students are attending secondary school
 - 41 students have graduated secondary school
 - 46 students are attending vocational college
 - 14 students are attending higher education institutes
 - 63 students are eligible and awaiting funding to attend university



397 Students Currently or Will Have Foundation Rwanda-Funded Bicycles for Next Year

217 students currently have Foundation Rwanda-funded bicycles

An estimated 180 students will receive a Foundation Rwandafunded bicycle next year

440 Mothers and Children Have Received Healthcare Services Through Foundation Rwanda

220 mothers received healthcare services through Foundation Rwanda

12 mothers received treatment for gynecological problems resulting from rape during the genocide

2 mothers received corrective surgery for fistula

220 mothers were screened for oral cancer and received oral health treatment

220 children received healthcare services through Foundation Rwanda

5 students received treatment for chronic eye and teeth problems and were able to return to school

220 students were screened for oral cancer and received oral health treatment

610 Mothers and Children Received Counseling Services Through Foundation Rwanda

400 individuals received or are currently receiving trauma counseling

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320 mothers have received or are currently receiving trauma counseling

80 students received HIV and trauma counseling through Bike Build Program

210 mothers indirectly received counseling

200 women petitioned the Rwandan Government for pledged support and advocated on behalf of themselves and their families

20 women are members of the Abasangiye Cooperative producing handicrafts for Indego Africa and are now economically independent

Our goal, 20 years after the Rwandan genocide, is to ensure all students complete their schooling and/ or access vocational training by 2019. This requires a budget of \$875,430. This level of support will ensure Foundation Rwanda comes full circle, ensuring all students have completed schooling or vocational training and their mothers receive skills training, counseling and medical support, with support from our local partners Survivors Fund (SURF), Kanyarwanda, AVEGA Agahozo and Solace Ministries.




As a sunset, limited-life foundation with a specific mission, Foundation Rwanda seeks to meet its funding goal in 2014 and to transfer the program by January 2015 to our local implementing NGOs with Survivors Fund (SURF Rwanda) as the main implementing partner. Together, we will work to strengthen partner capacity, provide oversight and monitoring on grant disbursements and work to anticipate the evolving needs of the FR families. We have already begun planting seeds and will continue to urge our partners to seek local partnerships for educational and holistic support projects for FR families.

We will continue to empower mothers and students to advocate locally for Rwandan government support for:

Scholarships for university for those exceptional students who pass the national exams and are eligible and eager for higher education.

Income generating and vocational support amongst the young people who do not progress to university to ensure that they can be financially independent and self-sufficient. We hope that over time these students will be able to support their mothers.

Psychosocial support for secondgeneration survivors. This support could address potential intergenerational inheritance of trauma as secondgeneration survivors begin to have children of their own, as well as ongoing issues that they may continue to face resulting from their own traumatic experiences.
